

Business reminded of April 15 Deadline for filing Property Tax Renditions

A “rendition” is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you owned or managed on January 1st of this year.

Texas law requires that you report, or render your income-producing personal property - such as inventory, furniture and fixtures, machinery and equipment, vehicles and other property used by a business.

Rendition helps the appraisal district appraise property fairly and accurately. Rendering allows property owners to record their opinion of their property's value and ensures that the appraisal district sends them a notice before changing a value on their property.

The chief appraiser will impose a penalty of 10 percent to 50 percent of the total amount of the taxes on a person who fails to timely file a rendition statement.

If more than one appraisal district appraises a property, the property owner should render in each appraisal district office.

The last day for filing 2026 renditions is April 15. On written request, the chief appraiser shall extend a deadline for filing a rendition statement or property request to May 15. The chief appraiser may further extend the deadline an additional 15 days upon good cause shown in writing by the property owner.
